JudoScotland, as the National Governing Body for judo, is responsible for supporting the development of clubs, coaches and its members. As we approach the first milestone in what is undoubtedly the most exciting time in Scottish judo's history, the London 2012 Olympic Games, and with Glasgow 2014 on the horizon, that support is about to grow.

We are a relatively small Governing Body with big ambitions for our sport. With a growing membership in excess of 8300, 148 clubs and approx 230 active coaches, we are looking to raise the level of support offered to the judo workforce in Scotland and to increase the capacity of a dedicated organisation in delivering its Education and Development programmes.
