Within our mission to provide direction and support to ensure our members enjoy a positive impact when playing judo, **JudoScotland** provide a framework of guidance on how the role of all participants can contribute.

The following underlines some key expectations and highlights additional sources that clarify the behaviour and conduct expected of the role.

Principal statement on Ethics

Sporting integrity is based on the acceptance of rules, fairness, equality, respect for others, moral conduct and a sense of what is right. Scottish sport's goal is to create a sporting environment where violence, breaking the rules, the abuse of drugs, the lack of fair play and other unethical behaviour are automatically rejected as being irrelevant to the true purpose of sport.

To ensure that I make a positive contribution to JudoScotland I agree to:

- 1. Abide by the Principal Statement of Ethics above.
- 2. Ensure I maintain all relevant memberships and qualifications related to my role.
- 3. Adhere to the guidance and recommendations contained within 'Safelandings' British Judo & **JudoScotland's**. Child Protection Policies and Procedures.
- 4. Provide appropriate activities, programmes and sessions for the age and ability of the participants.
- 5. Take responsibility for remaining informed and up-to-date regarding sound coaching principles, relevant legislation and of the rules of the sport.
- 6. Consider the wellbeing and safety of all judoka before the development of performance.
- 7. Strive to comply with the judo moral code at all times.
