





JudoScotland was represented across the globe in 2024. Here are just a few highlights from an inspiring year of international representation:

## Scotland

Judo in Scotland continued to grow in 2024, from hosting international Judoka at the Scottish Open, to expanding grassroots opportunities for female participation, and celebrating JudoScotland's recognition as Scottish Governing Body of the Year, there has been much to celebrate.

## Venray

In November, Scottish VI and Adapted Judoka competed in Venray at both the EJU Get Together Tournament and the Open European II Judo Championships.

Sean Allan and Christopher Murphy took gold at the Championships, while the Get Together Tournament saw gold for Chris Murphy and Murray McConnell, silver for Rebecca Lamb, and bronze for Sean Allan.

Stephen Somerville, JudoScotland's Disability Development Officer, also attended to gather insights for hosting similar inclusive events in Scotland.

## Walsall

In July, five out of six Scottish teams medalled at the British National Teams Championship, with the Cadet/Junior Men securing gold, backed by the passionate support of Scottish fans at the University of Wolverhampton, Walsall Campus.

## Paris

Loretta Doyle 9<sup>th</sup> Dan held the role of Senior Technical Operations Manager for Judo and Wrestling at the Paris 2024 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

## Taipei

Alex Short won silver at the Taipei Asian Open in the -73kg category.

## Japan

In October, the Kaizen Academy, accompanied by members of our Talent Development squad, travelled to Japan to enhance their Judo skills and support their development.

## Riga

Finlay Allan topped the EJU senior -66kg rankings with gold in Riga, while Josie Steele made a strong comeback from injury with podium finishes in both Riga and Prague.
